TIPS FOR TOBACCO RETAILERS

PREVENTING ILLEGAL UNDERAGE SALES OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS

- No tobacco products or paraphernalia may be sold to anyone under age 21. As of December 20, 2019, the federal age of sale for tobacco products is 21 with no exemption for military personnel.
- Train store clerks to ask for ID every time and check birthdates carefully.
- · Accept only valid government-issued photo ID's (driver's license, state ID, passport, military ID).
- Federal law states that retailers MUST check ID for tobacco product purchasers who appear to be younger than 27 years old.

TOBACCO RETAILERS MUST BE LICENSED IN CALIFORNIA

- Businesses in California that sell cigarettes and other tobacco products, including electronic smoking devices, must have a California Cigarette and Tobacco Products Retailer License.
- Display your tobacco retailer licence so your customers can see it.

DISPLAY STAKE ACT AGE OF SALE WARNING SIGNS AT EACH REGISTER

The Sale of Tobacco Products to Persons Under 21 Years of Age Is Prohibited by Law and Subject to Penalties

To Report an Unlawful Tobacco Sale Call 1-800-5 ASK-4-ID

Valid Identification May Be Required

Post the required STAKE Act age-of-warning signs at each cash register.

FOLLOW TOBACCO DISPLAY AND SALES LAWS

- No self-service display of tobacco products or No sales of single cigarettes or cigarette paraphernalia. (Some exceptions for tobacco only stores.)
- packs with less than 20 cigarettes.
